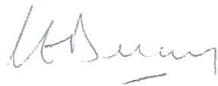

Modern Slavery Act Statement

Modern Slavery is a crime and a violation of human rights.

The Modern Slavery Act 2015 applies to all organisations, whatever the sector, which supply goods or services and which carry on a business or part of a business in the United Kingdom and whose global turnover exceeds £36 million. The Act requires such organisations to publish an annual slavery statement on their website.

As a provider of education to multiple schools, Bellevue Place Education Trust is committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business.

Bellevue Place Education Trust

BPET is a multi-academy trust with ten schools in London and Berkshire providing education for primary school pupils. We employ over 500 teachers and support staff across our ten locations and have ambitions to grow the size of the organisation in the coming years.

Supplier adherence

As an education provider, some services are outsourced to third party suppliers. In 2023, the BPET Board approved this Modern Slavery Act Statement, and we will ensure that going forward our

tendering process and 'New Supplier' form requests that all suppliers adhere to the Modern Slavery Act.

Should a supplier's compliance with the Act be demonstrated to be unsatisfactory, we will review our continued relationship with that supplier to ensure BPET's confirmed adherence with the act.

We are committed to investigating any allegations of modern slavery or human trafficking, whether in our own organisation or in our outsourced suppliers, and our Whistleblowing Policy has been reviewed to include reference to the Act.

We will continue to seriously investigate suppliers concerning their avoidance of modern slavery and human trafficking.

Monitoring and Evaluation

The Headteacher and BPET will review this policy statement biennially and update it in consultation with key staff, in line with current best practice as s/he considers necessary.
