



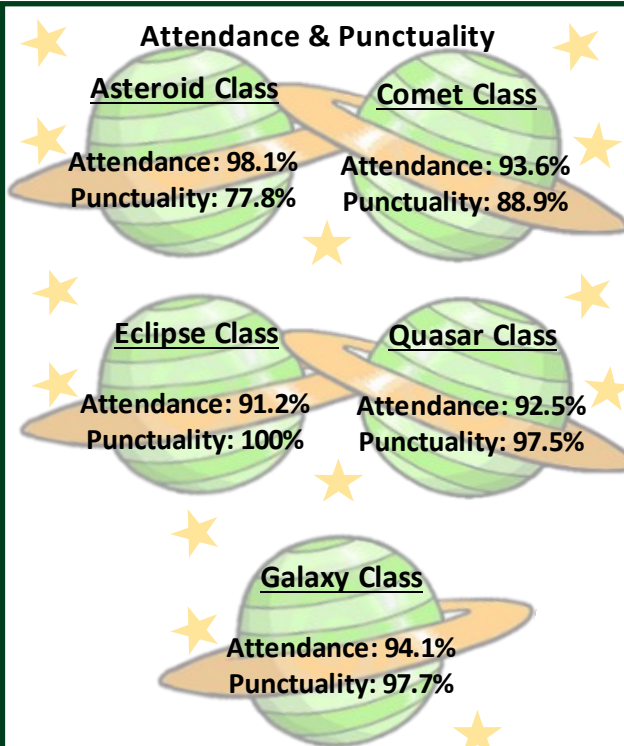

Monday Missions

Reception: This week our focus is outer space! Can you draw and label a picture of all the planets? Remember to bring it in to school to show your friends and teachers!

Year 1: We are learning about life under the sea. Can you find three animals that live under the sea and write a factfile about them? This could include which ocean they live in, what they eat and how long they live for!



Year 2: Using your prior knowledge from topic, design your own flying machine from the past. You could make it or draw it. Bring it to school to share with Galaxy Class.

What are the contributions towards school trips used for?

Further to my previous messages about the short fall in contributions towards school trips, I believe that there may be confusion about the use of money being requested. Let me clarify what the contributions are used for.

Thanks to TFL, the transport to and from the sites visited in London are free, as is the entry into many of the sites visited. The provision of Universal School Meals means that children attending infant schools are provided with a free lunch while out on school trips.

However, like all schools, we are required to cover the cost of workshops or activities provided to the children while they are out on school trips.

Schools are not allowed to make a profit from the organisation of any school trip so the outstanding contributions being requested now are to cover the actual cost of all trips taken during the autumn term 2017.

We have not accounted for such a high level of non-payment in our school budget so this means that, unless we are able to cover the costs of the autumn term trips, we will have no choice but to use funding that has been designated for other purposes at the school, such as the purchase of resources for the children.

I hope that you will appreciate that it also means that we cannot commit to organising any school trips for the spring term until we have collected outstanding contributions. It would be irresponsible of me to compound an already-serious financial situation.

I would be very grateful if outstanding contributions could be made on ParentPay as soon as possible.

I thank you for your consideration to this important issue.

New Procedure for signing in pupils who arrive late

If you are late you must sign your child in using the inventory computer system in reception. This will record the time of your arrival and the reason for your child's lateness. It is vital that your child is on time for school; as being late every day even by five minutes vastly reduces their learning time.

Parent View – Share Your Views of Halley House School

In the autumn term 2017, parents whose children started in EYFS in September were asked to share their views about the school. The outcomes from this survey will be posted on the school website this week.

The governors and Trust are also keen to understand the views of parents across the entire community so are now inviting you to share your views via Parent View on parentview.ofsted.gov.uk.

Parent View is an Ofsted website rather than a Trust website, giving you the chance to tell Ofsted what you think about Halley House School, from the quality of teaching to dealing with bullying and poor behaviour. The survey can be completed at any time; you don't have to wait until the school is being inspected. All results remain anonymous. Ofsted will use the information you provide when making decisions about which schools to inspect and when.

Once on the website, click on 'Give your views'. You will then be asked to register prior to being able to complete the survey.

School Uniform

It is great to see that the vast majority of pupils at Halley House School wear the correct uniform to school each day. I have, however, had to make contact with a small number of families this term to ask that school coats be worn. The challenge for other parents when their children see other children wearing their 'weekend coats' to school, they want to know why they can't do the same and it causes those early morning issues that we all want to avoid!

I would also remind that we prefer pupils to wear black shoes to school rather than trainers.

If your child needs to wear another coat or trainers to school for any reason, I would ask that you advise the class teacher at drop off in the morning.
