Communication

From last term, we will be continuing to reinforce using full sentences when answering questions, discussing our thoughts and ideas.

Expressive Arts

Our topic for this term is 'wonderful Wildlife', the children in their art lessons with Ms Hodgson will be specialising in observational drawing. Comet Class will be practicing to draw still life from a variety of mediums including photographs, models, and concrete objects in order to develop their museum drawing skills. I am looking forward to decorating our display boards with their art pieces.

Understanding the World

For PSHE, we follow the Jigsaw curriculum, our topic for this term is 'Dreams and Goals'. As part of this theme, Comet class will be learning about the world of work and all the different jobs that are available, one of which could be their future dream job. We plan to make lessons interactive by giving children glimpses into what jobs might involve, for example, visiting the fire station to learn about firefighters, or learning some first aid as part of being a doctor/nurse.

Literacy



Mathematics

This term we will continue to consolidating our knowledge around our number bonds to 10. We will continue explore the relationships between numbers utilising different methods to compose numbers to 10, including the 10s frame, counters and number blocks. We will continue to work on core skills such as subitising, one to one correspondence when counting and understanding the cardinal principle, we also hope to encourage a language rich lessons through the use of mathematical vocabulary.





Personal Development

We are continuously reviewing and reminding ourselves of the Halley House Values. On Monday mornings, Comet Class have in class assembly where we focus on one specific Halley House value through a story, and then use story for talk. For example, we looked at the value of being helpful and kind by read-
