Home learning debate and discussion




- N. What is your favourite Once Upon a Time story?

Curriculum updates

Nursery

We have been learning all about composition in maths where we learned 1 and another 1 is two. Apollo class then had a mission of finding two things within the classroom. The children rose to the challenge and found many things within the classroom. We also learned that two and another one is three and looked around our classroom finding three of the same objects.

After reading 'The Gingerbread Man', Apollo Class made gingerbread biscuits. We worked really hard, mixing all the ingredients together in our mixing bowls. The next day, after the Gingerbread biscuits had cooled, the children decorated them with icing and sprinkles.








Reception:

In Reception, over the past two weeks, Comet Class have taken part in whole class literacy. This has given the children more opportunities to write for different purposes and write different types of text. For example, in our first week of whole class writing, we enjoyed reading 'The three ninja pigs', and the children had an exciting time writing their own potion recipes to become a superhero ninja. Last week, Comet class developed their descriptive writing skills through story writing. We had a go at improving the story 'Handa's surprise' by adding our own ideas

using adjectives. For our final text this week, the class will be exploring the use of story maps as a way of storytelling and stepping foot into the world of riddles. The team are anticipating the amazing pieces of writing the class will produce during our last week of whole class literacy.







Year One

Over the last few weeks the children in Year One have been focusing on division and numbers to 100 in their Maths work. Using our knowledge of 'groups of' a number, the children have been solving a variety of problems designed to challenge their reasoning and counting skills. Last week we began focusing on numbers beyond 50, applying our knowledge of tens and ones to help us identify, make and partition numbers to 100.

In PSHE we have been talking about relationships we have with our family, our friends and members of our school community. As well as talking about how we greet both new and familiar people, we have been talking about personal space and what times this is important to us.

Finally, the wonderful Ms Jacqui (Asher and Julia's mum), who helped us make Victorian marbles last term, has delivered the finished product to school. The children can't wait to bring them home and show you their finished products.
